Year group: 5 Class: 5A and 5K

<u>Maths</u>	<u>English</u>	<u>Science</u>
<p>This term we will be reading, writing, comparing and ordering up to 6 digit numbers, understanding the place value and using < and > signs; rehearse mental addition strategies and solve missing number sentences.</p> <p>Children will also learn to read Roman Numerals to 1000 and recognise years written in Roman Numerals. Children will solve investigations based on Roman Numerals. The children will compare, recognise and solve algebraic equations. Children will interpret negative numbers and link it to temperature. Children will be able to recognise the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages.</p> <p>Children will solve multi-step problems with addition and subtraction as well as identifying missing values when calculating perimeter.</p>	<p>This term we will be reading a variety of modern text such as: <i>Ice Fairies</i> by Siobhan Parkinson. We will be focusing on inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions, and justifying inferences with evidence from the text. The children will compose their own narratives, describing settings, characters and atmosphere and will learn to integrate dialogue, to convey character and advance the action. We will also be looking at persuasive writing in non-fiction texts. We will look at how an argument is presented, what presentational devices are used to convey meaning and also look at cohesive devices used to make the text more effective.</p>	<p>This term Year 5 will be focusing on growth and growing up as well as becoming Super Scientists.</p> <p>Within growth and growing up, children will look at and describe the changes as humans develop to old age. Pupils draw a timeline to indicate stages in the growth and development of humans.</p> <p>In the topic of Super Scientists children work scientifically on a variety of quick challenges and longer tasks to learn about the different ways in which scientists work in the real world. This topic looks at the discoveries of famous scientists, the methods forensic scientists use and the various ways scientists tell others about new discoveries.</p>
<u>Art/DT/Geography/History/Music</u>		
<p>We are learning about Indus Valley. Children will discuss when and where the Indus Valley civilization existed. Children will also research what everyday life was like in the Indus Valley. The class will also research the significance of Mohenjo-Daro. In Year 5 Art, we will be looking at ceramics, focusing on the artist Rekha Goyal. Children will analyse artists work, make sketches of favourite parts. Music will be taught by ECAM where children will have the opportunity to play their guitar.</p>		
<u>Religious Education</u>	<u>P.E</u>	<u>PSHCE</u>
<p>Children in year 5 will be exploring stories from a range of religious traditions: the story of Adam and Eve, the story of Jonah, the story of Bilal and the story of the Buddha and Kisagotami. In each, they will be encouraged to look for levels of meaning and to apply what they have learnt to their own experiences.</p>	<p>This term children will be focusing on outdoor activities. Pupils will develop six basic skills these are: passing, setting, spiking, blocking, digging and serving.</p> <p>Pupils will also be covering running and jumping within athletics. The children will develop a deeper understanding of the crucial movement patterns that underpin these two disciplines to improve their distances and times.</p>	<p>The children will be looking at valuing each other. We will focus on how to deal with embarrassment and how not to make other people feel embarrassed. We will explore how important compliments are and how to show empathy to others. We will also look at stereotyping; how to recognise it and how to challenge it.</p> <p>This above work links in with our work on bullying to date.</p>

<p>The pupils will work on blogging. We will learn about the importance of blogs, how to create a sequence of blog posts and how to comment appropriately.
